KITCHEN FUN

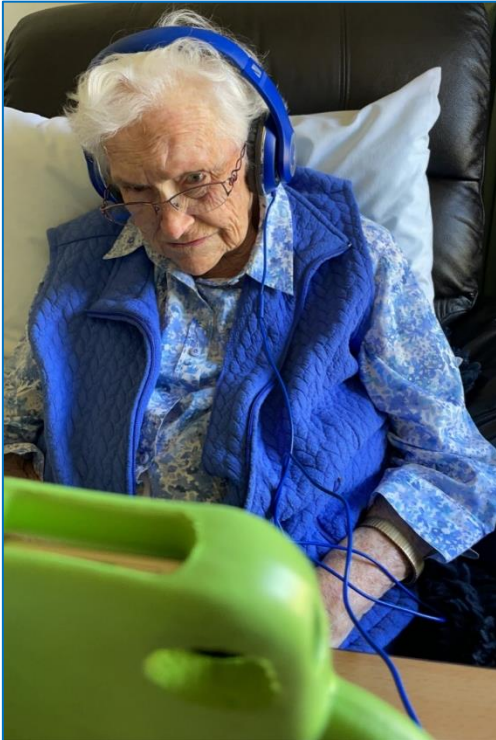

MESSENGER CHATS

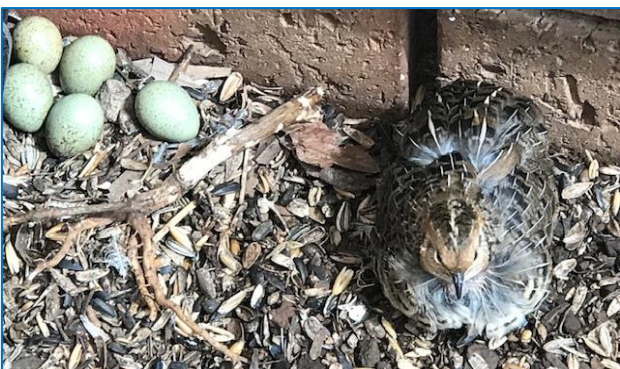
With restrictions hitting us once again as the COVID-19 virus still hangs around, families and friends have been communicating over the fence or by Facetime calls.

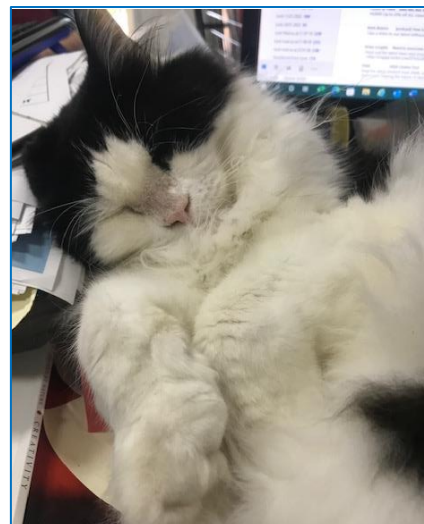


CEO REPORT
