We were lucky enough to win Joe's CD album and a box of chocolates. We have our suspicions that Adam took the chocolates home.

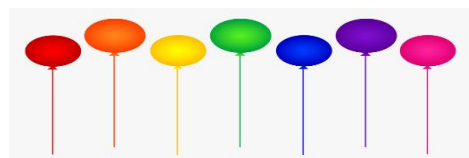
NEW STAFF
