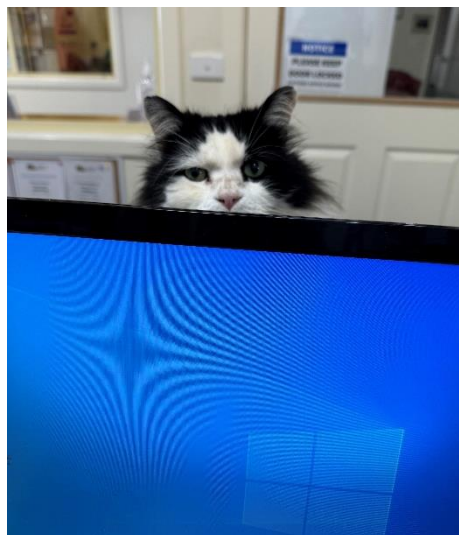
OLYMPICS
